UNITED CIVIL SERVANTS SACCO RECORD-BREAKING GROWTH IN 2023!

The year 2023 will remain one of the most memorable and fruitful years for United Civil Servants SACCO and its members across the country.

UCSSACCO held its 29th Annual General Meeting on 22nd March 2024 at Sunbird Capital Hotel in Lilongwe under the theme; "Save with Ease, Achieve Your Dreams", where it announced that the organization has made a groundbreaking surplus of 7 billion kwacha, savings of over K10 billion from 6.6 billion and expanded its membership base from 53 thousand to 65 thousand in 2023.

Speaking during the meeting, United Civil Servants SACCO outgoing Board Chairperson Sanderson Nyambwani expressed gratitude over the stellar performance that the SACCO has demonstrated.

"I'm extremely happy for this unprecedented growth that United Civil Servants SACCO has registered. It takes hard work and commitment to achieve remarkably like this. This is a clear indication that our SACCO is on the move transforming people's lives and contributing to the country's socio-economic development". Said Nyambwani.

"You might also wish to note that our SACCO has a loan book of K21 billion from K13 Billion of which enabled the SACCO to collect a revenue of K11.6 billion from K7 billion in 2022. As I sign

out from the position, I'm optimistic that the incoming leadership will continue growing the SACCO to higher heights", *He* added.

The guest of honour at the function who is also Minister of Trade Sosten Gwengwe, commended United Civil Servants SACCO for the crucial role it plays in empowering Malawians financially to become resilient to economic shocks. He indicated that United Civil Servants SACCO is significantly contributing to the realization of the Malawi 2063 vision in which financial inclusion is one of the key elements.

During the event, United Civil Servants SACCO members

took turns in sharing their success stories on how their lives have tremendously transformed. Later the meeting elected Madam Jessy Eneya from the Ministry of Health as its new Board Chairperson. Of the 7 billion surplus, members shared 2 billion as dividends, representing a dividend payment rate of 18%. The rest of the surplus was reserved to grow the capital of the Great United Civil Servants SACCO and for other strategies such as digital and brand promotion.
